## The President's Column SEPTEMBER 2025 by Laurene Lambertino-Urquizo



Those of you who know me well, know me to be a political junkie. I have been one all my life. I distinctly remember in grade school telling my classmates about the "haves and the have-nots." I was surely mimicking what I had heard at home from my liberal democrat parents. But that lib-

# GREEN SANCTUARY BY JEFF GREEN - SEPTEMBER 2025



Fenn Taylor of the Park Forest UU church started the Care for the Earth series of talks after service. After Fenn passed away, the church asked me to take over the series. 3 wonderful years went by in global warming talks of various subjects. With declining attendance to the point of no one showing up, well maybe its time to retire this topic. Then Donald Trump was elected. I gave my last talk on that very topic of DJT and care for the earth with 10 people attending. Now that DJT is back in office, it's time for the long game at the federal level. As we feared, DJT is now much more skilled in getting his way in the presidency. Today is different than 2015. Today, some aspects will keep on going in spite of his efforts. This is where I live part of the time, supporting where I can, what I would like the future of our earth to be. How do we get through 3.5 more years of authoritarian rule, dead set against our values? I put the question to Deep Seek, and below is the shortened response. Deep Seek loves to pump it out, and it was a little too much.

Begin Deep Seek Navigating the Next Few Years: A Resilient Approach to Sustainable Energy

- · Corporate Demand: Major companies are switching to renewables for cost savings and share-holder pressure, creating massive private-sector demand for new projects.
- · Global Momentum: China and the EU are continuing massive investments in renewables, ensuring global technological and manufacturing progress continues.
- 2. Redirect Your Advocacy & Support
- · Go Local: Attend city council meetings. Advocate for community solar, EV charging, energy efficiency codes, and public transit.
- · Go State: Support state-level politicians and policies. Vote in state elections—they are critical for energy policy. Push for stronger state Renewable Portfolio Standards (RPS).
- · Support Legal Defense: Donate to NGOs (e.g., Sierra Club, NRDC) who are successfully suing in court to block the rollback of environmental regulations.
- 3. Build Personal & Community Resilience
- · Lead by Example: If possible, install solar, upgrade to a heat pump, or choose a green energy provider to reduce your own footprint and demand.
- Strengthen Community: Join or start a community garden, local food co-op, or advocacy group. Build networks that are less dependent on federal politics.

- 4. Protect Your Well-being for the Long Game
- · Curate Information: Avoid constant outrage. Schedule news updates instead of consuming alerts all day.
- Find Your Niche: Focus on 1-2 tangible actions where you can see real impact (e.g., volunteering, local advocacy). These fight helplessness.
- · Connect with Others: Build community with like-minded people. Shared purpose provides emotional support and amplifies your efforts.

#### The Bottom Line

: This period is about resilience, not defeat. Your role is to hold the line through local and state action, build the alternative in your community, and stay ready to advance federal policy when the landscape shifts. The economic and scientific imperative for sustainability will ultimately prevail. End Deep Seek

My timeline for what I hoped our country would accomplish has changed. This will just take a little longer. Some leaders are just the antithesis of what we hold as our core values. How we express ourselves in the face of this time will be our legacy that we leave behind. What we do with our bodies and spirits will have an impact on the direction of our country. 


## RAINBOW-CAFE

## **UUMUAC 3<sup>rd</sup> Wednesday Worship Service September 17, 2025** "Church of the Free Spirit" by Dr. Matthew Shear

What shall we call a true liberal religion? I contend that labels from past centuries will not do in our time. In this service I will explore concepts I've come to believe are essential to a workable intersection of liberalism with religion and society.

Dr. Matthew Shear is a 1980 graduate of the New England College of Optometry and completed a post-graduate program from the Baltimore Academy for Behavioral Optometry in 2002. He has also trained as a peer counselor, eventually teaching the technique to others. His particular interest is in the effects of misperception on our understanding of ourselves and the world, and how that affects our behaviors. This focus eventually led him from clinical practice to becoming a religious professional. He began preaching lay led services in 2007, and in 2018 was engaged by Channing Church in Rockland, MA as their full time Preacher, where he served for two years. A former Board member of UUMUAC, he is still an occasional preacher of their 3rd Wednesday Vesper services and elsewhere.

With attacks on our UU values and the democratic system itself increasing, many of us are seeing a need to ramp up our efforts. Simple **legislative advocacy** efforts like our Action of the Week emails and witness slips continue to be important, and we will continue to offer them. Actions that take more effort - like customizing your letters, making phone calls and meeting with legislators - are more impactful, and we have started offering more of these opportunities to make a difference. These will be needed as we seek to help pass crucial <u>climate</u> and <u>restorative justice</u> legislation in this October's veto session in Illinois, and to stop US funding of the genocide against the people of Gaza.

Beyond such advocacy, we know that the electoral process has a significant impact on what happens legislatively. So we are gearing up for the next round of **VoteLove** (as UUtheVote is known here in Illinois). Here, too, we will continue to offer simple actions like writing postcards to encourage people to vote. And we plan to offer actions that take more effort - like community fo-

rums, <u>phonebanking</u> and <u>knocking on doors</u> - that have been proven to be even more effective. It's not too early to consider what level of participation you're up for.

And beyond all this, we are seeing the rise of an authoritarian regime threatening our democratic system and the rule of law. Many UUs are joining the just-launched **One Million Rising** campaign of strategic noncooperation and nonviolent resistance. Two actions that you can take now are: <u>Ground Avelo Airlines</u> and <u>Signs of Solidarity against ICE</u>. You will hear more about this campaign in the weeks and months ahead.
