We have a president who wants history to smile upon and glorify him. If that happens, it won't be because of me. I am all for wanting to make America great but sticking with fossil fuels while suppressing renewable energy isn't the path to historical greatness. Renewable energy is the cheaper healthier energy and is getting cheaper every year. The economics of that is now quite evident in the countries that are ahead of us in this effort. The reality of RE is that it is basically unstoppable. I doubt that our president could really care less about our health and cost of energy, otherwise fossil fuels would be on its way out the door instead of prolonging us in dirty more costly energy.

Featured South Australia as a global proof point for renewable energy effectiveness, noting the state's transformation from coal-dependent to 74% renewables in just a decade.

Big, beautiful coal is the mantra while renewable energy delivers the results we would all like to have. Cleaner cheaper healthier renewable energy for all. The article claims a 30% drop in the price of electricity, yet by my math it's about 65% drop in the price of electricity. If I have made a mistake, then let me know.

Quote:

****from \$104 AU/MWh in Q3 2025 to just \$37 AU/MWh in Q4 2025 (approximately **2.6 US cents per kilowatt hour**). This is the lowest wholesale price across all of Australia, and it happened while demand actually *increased* by 1.2% to record levels.****unquote

Fossil fuels cannot compete. South Australia has gone from a mostly coal region to a mostly renewable energy region in about 10 years. By 2027, South Australia has plans to be at 100% RE.

Quote:

****Some [74% of South Australia's electricity consumption](#) is provided by renewables, and the state plans to make that 100% by 2027, in only two years. Wind, solar and battery generated 100% of the state's electricity for 99 days (27% of the time) in 2024, the last year for which full data are available as yet.**** unquote

Do we want expensive dirty energy or do we want far cheaper clean energy. This is a no brainer.

In some ways it feels strange that a president can be so resistant to renewable energy and here is a shining example of just how profound it can be in changing our lives. DJT promised to lower our costs when in fact, it is the opposite in that he is making take the more expensive route. Above note that the state's (South Australia) electricity was 100% renewable for 99 days. California has a similar record for over 100 days of 100% solar energy.

******California had 219 days in 2024 (last year) when 100% clean energy met or exceeded demand for at least part of the day.******

This is a fight to keep the message based in reality. Fossil fuels is losing in the marketplace and the only place left to help them (FF) out is the government. We are now in a winning position economically; all we need now is a fair fight. The rest of the world is getting it.

The [Unitarian Universalist Advocacy Network of Illinois](#) (UUANI) is a 501(c)(3) organization that mobilizes Illinois UUs for statewide advocacy on social justice issues, aligning spiritual values with action. It empowers congregations to work in solidarity with marginalized groups through legislative lobbying, leadership training, and educational initiatives aimed at creating systemic change. The advocacy work done by UUs throughout Illinois in conjunction with UUANI positively impacts state law and policies that affect those in Chicago's southern suburbs, as well as those living elsewhere in Illinois.

Key Aspects of UUANI

- **Advocacy Areas:**
 - **Climate Justice:** Promoting renewable energy and equitable transportation infrastructure.
 - **Restorative Justice:** Supporting criminal justice reforms like eliminating cash bail, reducing mandatory minimums, and supporting parole for seniors.
 - **LGBTQ+ Rights:** Advancing legal equality and safety for all families.
 - **Economic Justice:** Advocating for fair wages and addressing homelessness.
 - **Strategic Action:** The organization provides "Actions of the Week" to make engagement easy for individuals, conducts research, and builds coalitions with partner organizations.
 - **Structure:** It operates as a network connecting Unitarian Universalist congregations across Illinois to amplify their collective voice.



The primary goal of UUMUAC is Multiracial Unity, described by Martin Luther King Jr. as the “Beloved Community.”

Reaching this goal requires unification of the progressive peoples of the world in the struggle against inequality and injustice.

Our Vision We envision our congregations, associations, and communities as being not color blind but color appreciative; as judging and treating people by the content of their character, not the color of their skin, their cultural heritage, or other identity; and as treasuring all forms of diversity in the context of Martin Luther King’s Jr’s “Beloved Community.” We call this vision Multiracial Unity.

Our Mission It is the mission of the Unitarian Universalist Multiracial Unity Action Council to foster activities for multiracial unity and to counter racism and neo-racism through worship, education, bearing witness, and other actions, and to find and engage like-minded individuals and groups.

We affirm the inherent worth and dignity of every person, and strive to defend freedom, reason, and tolerance as articulated in the Seven Principles of Unitarian Universalism adopted in 1985. This includes promoting their use in individual congregations, through congregational autonomy, and in our own actions.


