The President's Column June 2026 by Laurene Lambertino-Urquizo



Every year in May, our congregation holds an Annual Meeting that allows us to put decisions to our members for important issues that face our church. Our Annual Meeting this year was May 17th. My two terms as Board President comes to an end this month June, so now the UUCC Board of Trustees will begin a new chapter with a new President, Vice President and two Trustees, as we pass the baton on to them. I think the most important aspect of this change is that the continuity of governance continues smoothly. Our Nominating Committee had assembled a slate of candidates that demonstrates that this is of high importance for this congregation, especially in the area of our finances & budgetary spending. We must consistently make good decisions about how we spend our money. We are a relatively small congregation, and we do not receive monetary assistance from our denomination, therefore we rely on support through our membership. We have done an excellent job conserving our resources under the skillful eye of our Treasurer, Nancy Irons, and we are fortunate to have her. Our survival depends on the income we receive through pledges, weekly donations, memorials, and interest from our investments. This stable source of income has been enhanced by making a series of improvements and updates to areas of the church that were beginning to show its age.

I began my first term by looking at areas that we could improve. We have a beautiful building in a forest setting that is a perfect place for parties and get togethers as it stands empty for much of its time. We needed to work on a few areas to bring them up to speed. The kitchen needed transforming, various rooms needed updating, and the surrounding grounds (still) needs a lot of work. So, to tackle all this, I chose Irene van der Hoek, and she, in turn, chose members for the Rental Team. They were a remarkable group of people who did a fantastic job of bringing the church back into good shape. Before long, we started getting rental inquiries and bookings, and this gave us a real boost to our income. And with increased income we were able to accomplish more repairs and programs.

Four years ago when I began on the board, I looked around at what other areas we needed to work on to maintain our economic stability and survival. We have been losing members over the years as time has brought them to the end of their life's paths. We also had problems of attracting new members to Unitarian Universalism as sociologically there has been a downward trend in many Western religions causing large numbers to leave their former practice of attending and supporting Protestant churches as our cultural norms changed. For as long as I can remember, we have tried to attract new members to our church. And while we occasionally were successful, it was not in the numbers that we had hoped to attract, but it is a goal that we continue to work towards. We always have various projects that we are working on and need volunteers to accomplish them. Please consider getting involved with the work of this church. There are projects that we would like to take on, such as starting up a new Buildings and Grounds Committee to improve and protect our beautiful church and setting. We are currently working on repaving our parking lot right now with our Capital Campaign.

I am grateful to have had the privilege to have served this church and congregation over the past two terms, and I have enjoyed my tenure here on the board. I am thankful to all our board members, past and present, who have worked for our collective benefit over the years. We indeed have been fortunate to have such a great congregation here. I also thank our current Board of Trustees and appreciate them for working so hard with me to keep UUCC a place to call home for our nearby neighbors and Zoom communities. Thank you!

· Europe (The Regulated): Locked in transition with a 2035 mandate for zero emissions, making the ICE phase-out inevitable .

On February 1, 2026, California's batteries bridged the solar gap with seamless precision. After discharging through the night until sunrise, they spent the daylight hours charging, then pivoted back to exporting power well past midnight—effectively sustaining the state on solar energy for a full 24-hour cycle.

In a sense, this is a milestone and yet there is more to go on California's progress. Producing enough clean energy, enough batteries, to power all through the night and start all over the next day.

In a sense, I want to thank DJT for exposing the weakness of fossil fuels with the Iran war and declaring climate a scam. With a firehose of untruths coming out of him, presenting honest clean information is the place to be.

Climate science is still using tools that project future pollution states based on our pollution emissions, just now ones that are on track with the present world change.
